

 People with a learning disability and autistic people are included in talking about the Health and Wellbeing Strategy (plan) the CCG's work for the next 3 years




Jim can join the Work Group.

• Annie and Ken will ask Rasool what is happening and when and how Splat can be involved.







Talk to providers about a 'provider forum'




