The list of people who came to the meeting and people who said they could not come.



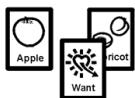
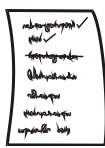
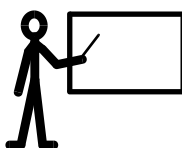
Actions from last time

People agreed that Splat needs clear notes and presentations. Also help making new symbols.



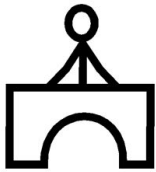

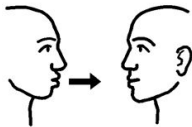
Work and Health - update

Sarah said it is important that people get good care and support in the community – not live in hospital for a long time.



People need experts to support them in the community if things start to go wrong. But it is difficult to find the right services and they can be very expensive.



Things we agreed about Transforming Care



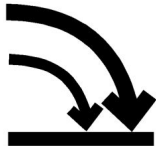
Ask Tess Hullett to come to the next Board to talk about supporting children and young people.

Justin said there was an **awareness day** in Autism Week. This helped council staff understand how to support autistic people better with things like getting a job.



Lots of people went and they said it was really useful. It would be good to organise an event like this next year.

Safe places - update



There is no funding for Safe Places and Smile Stop Hate Crime in Nottingham City. Karen works in the county but is trying to cover the city too.



At the moment Karen can support Safe Places in the City but not set up new ones.



Karen is working in Mansfield and Nottingham City to help people feel safe to go out at night. She is:

- talking to people about how to stay safe
- talking to places like bars and clubs about how to support people.



Steve Harrison said the council and police are trying to reduce crime. But they spend a lot of time on terrorism and knife crime.

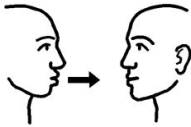
He thought it would be good to do an **audit** or check of Safe Places each year. He said Splat could help with this.



Community Learning Disability teams - update



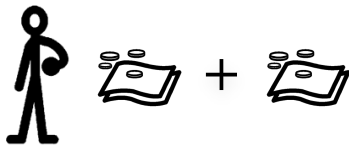
Kate said there are still 2 City teams.



They meet every 2 weeks to talk about people who need support and the best way to work together. This makes it easier to keep track of what is happening.



You have one lead person to talk to – even if lots of people are working with you on different things.



Integrated Personal Commissioning (IPC)



Tinu said this helps people choose how they get support. It brings together **personal health budgets** and **personal budgets**.



This means you know how much your services cost but can choose how to spend the money on the support you need.



The project is working with some groups first to see if people get better support this way.



Things we agreed about IPC



Tinu will go to the Listening Day to tell people more about the IPC project.



'Splat to the Future'



We need a plan to get ready for next March when Splat is not funded by the council. It will need to be an independent organisation, like a **Community Interest Company** or **CIC** to get money.



Reps from the Working Group talked about things we need to do.

Board members worked in groups to think about these questions:

- Who will do it?
- When will we do it?



Things we agreed about planning for Splat



- Annie will send out information about the Steering Group, Being a Community Interest Company and Being a director



- The **steering** or planning group will meet before 7th July



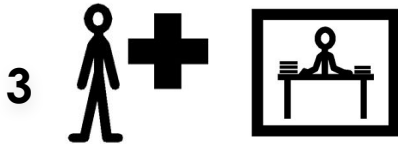
- Vox will ask people involved with Splat if they can share their contact information with the new Splat organisation

News-round

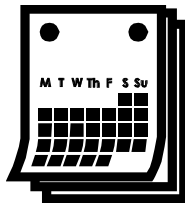


Shelly said the Learning Disability Liaison team has new staff – 3 nurses and one admin worker
