

Work and Health - update



Claire said the Big Work Group will become part of the Council's Whole Life and Disability work.

Jake Jacobs is leading this. He would like to come to a Listening Day to talk about how to work together.



Liz used Splat's ideas in the Health and Wellbeing Strategy. She will add in the ideas from the CCG focus group.



Advocacy - update



The new City and County advocacy service for heath and social care will start in October 2016.



Advocates must have the right training and skills.



They will only give **statutory advocacy** (advocacy the law says people must have).

The service will tell people who cannot get advocacy about other organisations that could support them.



The Councils and CCGs have money for 2 years to support people who cannot get advocacy. They will work with carers and self-advocates to think about how to use this.



We talked about this at the Advocacy Day – one idea is to have 'Advocacy Champions' in services.



Things we voted and agreed about advocacy:



 People agreed we need clear information about the advocacy service and how to contact them.



 Rasool will talk about the contract at the September Board and talk about advocacy training for staff.



 Splat will be involved in saying how the service is working and what it feels like for people who use it.




 Rasool will ask the new advocacy service to come to the listening Day in October.



Autism Co-production Group - update



The website is up now and a small group of people will work on what goes on it.



City Council staff and other organsiations are doing 'e-learning' training about autism.



The group are looking at other ways to get involved in training.



The group will do a survey to ask what people think about it.



In July there will be a training video on the City Council website.



In September there will be training for GPs



New Website Directory



Amy Groom talked about the new directory website which will start in October – it will be like 'Tripadvisor' to help people choose services'.



The Council has learnt from the problems with Choose My Support.

Amy wants to make sure this website is easy to use and will involve Splat in checking this.



Fasttrack - update



Fasttrack is a government plan to help people get good care and support in the community.



Rachel said the CCG project will look at 6 things:



- 1. Working together to keep people safe and stop them having to go back into hospital
- 2. Community support to stop people going into hospital
- 3. Trying out a community crisis team for one year



4. Finding out what staff need to know so the CCG plans the right training



5. Money to pay for the right care and support (using things like personal budgets)



6. Communication and involving people – finding out what people think. Groups to check the CCG is doing the things people need.



Things we agreed about Fasttrack:



 The police should be involved – they are looking at how to support people properly



 Rachel or a member of the team will feed back at the Listening Day -about how SPLAT can be involved.



Safe places - update



Denise said they advertised Safe Places on the trams.



There is information on the DVD and the SPLAT website.



There will be a short 'trailer' advertising Safe Places at the cinema.



Denise is working on a map to show where Safe Places are and tell people about them. She will show this to people at the Listening Day.



She wants to know whether people would use a Safe Places phone app. There is a link to the questions in these notes.



Self-advocates do training to help people understand learning disability. There is information about the July workshop with these notes.

Alan Lowen is working on the plan. He said the ideas were really helpful. He said Jim did a great job on an easier to read version of the paper in a short time.






CCG Plan – what people said
